REMINDER—

While on duty, that is working as a Citizen Academy Alumni, please remember to wear clothing which presents you to the public as a representative of the Citizen Police Alumni Academy.

The official uniform is a white short or long sleeve polo, dark blue or black trousers or slacks.

However, the following is acceptable—jackets and sweatshirts worn during cold weather and shirts other than collared when weather permits. However, all clothing (shirts, sweat shirts, jackets and hats), must display the official IQCCPA logo. Secondly, shorts and trousers or slacks in a color other than blue or black are acceptable if they are neat and clean.

Displaying your ID badge is mandatory to signal to the public that you're participating in an approved capacity at an official event, function or patrol.

2007 Citizen Police Academy present a gift

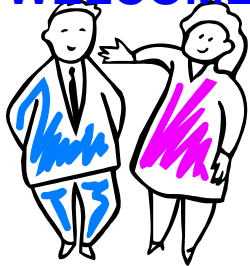


Members of the 2007 Citizen Police Academy presented this gift basket to Chief Redington during their graduation ceremony.

SCOTT COUNTY MOBILE COMMAND VEHICLE

Ross Bergen, Emergency Management Coordinator has arranged for the Mobile Command Vehicle to be available for members to tour following the June meeting.

A bit of editorializing—along with several members of the Association, we were given a tour of the vehicle and its operation. It's a marvel in what mission it can perform, both mechanically and electronically, and it's worth your time to come and see for yourself.

This vehicle is intended to provide needed support to an Incident Commander at the scene of one of the following: Homicide, Hostage, Drowning, Missing Person, and Multi-jurisdictional responses. Trained volunteers from the Emergency management Agency dispatch and operate the vehicle in support of the mission.

It was built with 24 tons of scrap steel from the World Trade Center.

It is the fifth in a new class of warship - designed for missions that include special operations against terrorists. It will carry a crew of 360 sailors and 700 combat-ready Marines to be delivered ashore by helicopters and assault craft.

Steel from the World Trade Center was melted down in a foundry in Amite, LA to cast the ship's bow section. When it was poured into the molds on Sept. 9, 2003, "those big rough steelworkers treated it with total reverence," recalled Navy Capt. Kevin Wensing, who was there. "It was a spiritual moment for everybody there."

Junior Chavers, foundry operations manager, said that when the trade center steel first arrived, he touched it with his hand and the "hair on my neck stood up." "It had a big meaning to it for all of us," he said. "They knocked us down. They can't keep us down. We're going to be back."

The ship's motto? "Never Forget"
